Did You Know? Many items can be recycled.

The City of Newton recycles these items...

Don't toss these items in the trash, recycle instead!

Items to recycle...	What to do...
• Aluminum Cans	Rinse and crush
• Steel Cans	Rinse and flatten
• Newspaper and glossy advertising inserts	Stack in a pile
• Glass bottles (clear or colored)	Rinse and remove lids
• Plastic soft drink bottles and milk jugs	Remove lids, rinse, and flatten
• Plastic laundry detergent bottles	Remove lids, rinse, and flatten
• Plastic containers that have a triangle emblem with # 1-7	Remove lids, rinse, and flatten
• Telephone Books	Stack in a pile
• Magazines	Stack in a pile
• Electronics	Bring to monthly drop-off event*



Note: Plastic bottles that contained automotive or petroleum products are not recyclable.

Reduce



Reduce the amount of garbage your family produces.

Reduce the amount of garbage your family throws away.

- Use cloth shopping bags or recycle paper or plastic bags.
- Encourage children to use both sides of paper when drawing or coloring.
- Encourage children to take care of their toys—broken toys become trash.
- Recycle bottles, cans, plastic, and paper.
- Think of creative ways to reuse household items.

Reuse

Anytime you use something over and over again you are saving our resources and helping keep our earth green.

For instance, used tires can be recycled into many different things. A few of them are listed below:

- Bulletin Boards
- Floor Mats
- Mulch
- Soaker Hoses
- Shoes
- Playground Equipment



Use empty glass jars to store small items like buttons, coins, and candy

Composting

You can recycle organic materials (fruit and vegetable peels, food scraps, lawn clippings, leaves, etc.) in your own composting bin!



Inside this dirt container, earthworms and other organisms

help decompose these natural materials.

After they're through, you can use the compost as fertilizer to help plants grow.
