GENERAL DEFINITION AND CONDITION OF WORK

Performs skilled work in officiating at competitive athletic or sporting events; does related work as required. Work is performed under general supervision.

This is medium work requiring the exertion of 100 pounds, of force occasionally, up to 50 pounds of force frequently, and up to 20 pounds of force constantly to move objects; assisting with maintenance to fields due to inclement weather, etc. Work requires stooping, kneeling, crouching, reaching, standing, walking, pushing, pulling, lifting, grasping and repetitive motions; vocal communications is required for expressing or exchanging ideas by means of the spoken word; hearing is required to perceive information at normal spoken word hearing is required to perceive information at normal spoken word levels; visual acuity is required in both depth perception, visual inspection involving small defects and/or small parts, to determine accuracy and thoroughness of work and observe general surroundings and activities; the worker is subject to both environmental conditions, extreme cold and extreme heat, noise and atmosphere conditions. The worker may be exposed to bloodborne pathogens and may be required to wear specialized protective equipment.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS/TYPICAL TASKS

Officiate at sporting events, games, or competitions, to maintain standards of play and to ensure that game rules are observed.

Performs skilled in officiating at competitive athletic or sporting events.

Detect infractions of rules and decide penalties according to established regulations.

Judge performances in sporting competitions in order to award points, impose scoring penalties, and determine results.

Signal participants or other officials to make them aware of infractions or to otherwise regulate play or competition.

Inspect sporting equipment and/or examine participants in order to ensure compliance with event and safety regulations.

Keep track of event times, including race times and elapsed time during game segments, starting or stopping play when necessary.

Start races and competitions.

Resolve claims of rule infractions or complaints to participants and assess any necessary penalties, according to regulations.

Verify scoring calculations before competition winners are announced.

Maintains reasonable and predictable attendance;

Performs related tasks as required;

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES

General knowledge of human behavior and performance; individual differences in ability, personality, and interests; learning and motivation; psychological research methods; and the assessment and treatment of behavioral and affective disorders. General knowledge of the structure and content of the English language including the meaning and spelling of words, rules of composition, and grammar. General knowledge of principles and processes for providing customer and personal services. This includes customer needs assessment, meeting quality standards for services, and evaluation of customer satisfaction. Considering the relative costs and benefits of potential actions to choose the most appropriate one. Being aware of others' reactions and understanding why they react as they do. The ability to tell when something is wrong or is likely to tell when something is wrong or is likely to go wrong. It does not involve solving the problem, only recognizing there is a problem. The ability to communicate information and ideas in speaking so others will understand. The ability to speak clearly so others can understand you. The ability to identify and understand the speech of another person. The ability to listen to and understand information and ideas presented through spoken words and sentences. The ability to see details at a distance. The ability to exert yourself physically over long periods of time without getting winded or out of breath. The ability to use your abdominal and lower back muscles to support part of the body repeatedly or continuously over time without "giving out" or fatiguing. The ability to see details at close range (within a few feet of the observer). The ability to arrange things or actions in a certain order or pattern according to a specific rule or set of rules (e.g., patterns of numbers, letters, words, pictures.)

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

Any combination of education and experience in the field of officiating. Minimum of 18 years old.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

Possession of a appropriate driver's license valid in the State of North Carolina, successful completion of specific training clinics, ability to clear background investigation.
